

ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1993-94

ELECTION DEPARTMENT

The Chief Electoral Officer is the Head of Election Department. He is assisted by one Joint Chief Electoral Officer, one Assistant Chief Electoral Officer and other departmental staffs. The Deputy Commissioners are District Election Officers in their respective districts.

During the period under report Summary Revision of Electoral Rolls with reference to 1.1.1994 as the qualifying date was carried out in 60(sixty) Assembly Constituencies in the State.

The total number of voters as on 12.3.1994 (date of final publication) was 12,85,394 out of which 6,45,744 were male voters and 6,39,799 were female voters.

During the period 100% inspection and physical verification of polling stations were carried out. After verification, the number of polling stations increased to 1977 from 1787.

ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1994-95

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During the period under report Intensive Revision of Electoral Roll with reference to 1.1.1995 as the qualifying date was carried out in all 60 (sixty) Assembly Constituencies of the State. The total number of voters in the State as on 4.1.95 (date of final publication) were 12,69,000 out of which 6,32,419 were male voters and 6,36,581 were female voters.

The total number of polling stations after necessary modification were increased to 1993 from 1977.

During 1994-95, Election to the Manipur Legislative Assembly was held. Election Notification was issued on 16th January, 1995 and poll was taken on 16th & 19th February, 1995 for the Hill and Valley Districts respectively. Election process was completed on 22nd February, 1995.

Election Commission of India has ordered for preparation and issue of Electoral Identity Cards to all eligible voters for easy identification of voters and also to curb bogus voting. Accordingly the process for preparation and issue of electoral identity cards were started in the State during the year.

ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1995-96

ELECTION DEPARTMENT

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During the period under report Summary Revision of Electoral Rolls with reference to 1.1.1996 as the qualifying date was carried out in all the 60(sixty) Assembly Constituencies of the State. The total number of voters as on 1.1.1996 was 12,86,260 out of which 6,38,438 were male voters and 6,47,822 were female voters.

The total number of polling stations were increased to 1998 from 1993.

Election for 17-Lamshang Assembly Constituency which was countermanded was held during the year. Election Notification was issued on 26th April, 1995. Poll was taken on 27th May, 1995 and result declared on 29th May, 1995.

Election to Lok Sabha was also conducted during 1996. Election Notification was issued on 27th March, 1996 and poll was taken on 7th May, 1996, for both the two Parliamentary Constituencies. Election process was completed with the declaration of result on 12th May, 1996.

During the year under report 10,74,154 number of voters were photographed, and 9,52,953 number of photo identity cards were issued to voters out of 12,85,113 number of total voters. An amount of Rs.5,17,03,163/- was spent for the purpose.

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
Annual Administrative Report for the year,

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

ELECTION DEPARTMENT : GOVERNMENT OF MANIPUR

Organisational set up.



Election Department is purely a non - plan Deptt. it functions under the guidance of Election Commission of India.

All Electoral activities of the department are under the control, direction and supervision of the Election Commission of India.

All Deputy Commissioners are designated as the District Election Officers of their respective districts.

All Deputy Commissioners in respect of Bishnupur, Thoubal, Chandel, Ukhrul, Senapati, Tamenglong and Churachandpur Districts and Sub-Divisional Officers in respect of Imphal West - I, Imphal West - II, Imphal East - I, Imphal East - II and Jiribam are designated as Electoral Registration Officers in respect of the Assembly Constituencies under their jurisdiction.

The Deputy Commissioner Imphal is the Returning Officer for both Inner Manipur and Outer Manipur (ST) Parliamentary Constituencies.

The Deputy Commissioners in respect of Bishnupur, Thoubal, Chandel, Ukhrul, Tamenglong, Tamenglong and Churachandpur are the Returning Officers in respect of the Assembly Constituencies under their jurisdiction.

The Deputy Commissioner Senapati is the Returning Officer of all Assembly Constituencies of the District excepting Assembly Constituencies falling under the jurisdiction of Additional Deputy Commissioner, Kangpokpi.

The Additional Deputy Commissioner Kangpokpi is the Returning Officer of all Assembly Constituencies under his jurisdiction.

The Sub - Divisional Officers in respect of Imphal West - I, Imphal West - II, Imphal East - I, Imphal East - II and Jiribam are the Returning Officers in respect of Assembly Constituencies under their jurisdiction.

The Joint Chief Electoral Officer is the Head of Office and Drawing and Disbursing Officer of Election Deptt. (except the pay and allowances of the officers and staffs who are attached in the office of the Deputy Commissioners Bishnupur, Thoubal, Chandel, Ukhrul, Senapati, Tamenglong and Churachandpur and Sub - Divisional Officer Jiribam).

The Assistant Chief Electoral Officer deals with all Estt. Matters, Court cases, Electoral complaints etc..

The Assistant Election Officer/C&C. is responsible for conduct of Elections.

The Assistant Election Officer/R&D. is responsible for preparation of Electoral Rolls & Maintenance of Records and Datas.

The Assistant Election Officer/PIC. is responsible for preparation and issue of Photo - Identity Cards.

The Sr. Accountant is responsible for all account matters.

There are at present 159 (one E.R.C. under suspension) numbers of employees working in the Department excluding one Asstt. C.E.O. and one Jt. C.E.O. (both full time) .

Details of staffs posted in the office of the C.E.O, D.C's and S.D.O's is also annexed herewith.
