

**ELECTION DEPARTMENT: MANIPUR
ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT, 2006-2007
(ended 7th March, 2007).**

1. INTRODUCTION:

1.1. The State Election Department is a single cadre non-plan department with total staff strength of 168 posts of 20 various categories with Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur as Head of the Department. Joint Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur is the Drawing & Disbursing Officer (DDO) of CEO's Office, Manipur. Shri R.R. Rashmi, IAS (MT-83) is currently holding the charge of Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur. One post of Addl. CEO, Manipur has recently been created to assist in the conduct of the just concluded Assembly Elections, 2007 and is currently manned by Shri P.K. Singh, IAS (MT-93). Shri T. Ranjit Singh, MCS, is the Joint Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur.

1.2. There are 24 branch offices where the election staff and Officers are attached/posted. The offices are the offices of Deputy Commissioners of 9 Districts and the offices of ADCs of Jiribam and Kangpokpi and SDOs/EROs of Lamphel, Patsoi, Lamsang, Wangoi, Porompat, Sawombung, Keirao Bitra, Nambol, Bishnupur, Moirang, Thoubal, Lilong and Kakching.

1.3. The Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur is the Head of the Election Department. He is appointed by the Election Commission of India from a panel of Officers furnished by the State Government. The Chief Electoral Officer, who is directly responsible to the Election Commission of India, has the statutory responsibility of supervising the preparation of electoral rolls and conduct of Assembly, Parliamentary and Presidential elections in the State and assisting the Delimitation Commission in the delimitation of Assembly and Parliamentary Constituencies subject to the overall control, direction and supervision of the Election Commission of India.

1.4. DCs are the EROs in the 5(five) Hill Districts, Addl. Deputy Commissioner, Kangpokpi and the Sub-Divisional Officers (SDOs) in the 4(four) Valley Districts and the Addl. Deputy Commissioner, Jiribam are the EROs in the Valley Districts. There are altogether 20(twenty) EROs in Manipur State. It is to point out that the Sub-Divisional Officers (SDOs) in the Hill Districts and most of the Sub-Deputy Collectors (SDCs) in Valley Districts are the Asstt. Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs). There are a total of 54 (fifty four) AEROs in the State. The EROs are directly responsible for correct and complete E/Rolls of A.C.s within their jurisdiction.

1.5. In Hill Districts, the Deputy Commissioners function as the District Election Officers/Electoral Registration Officers/Returning Officers for the purpose of Assembly Elections. The ADC/Jiribam and ADC/Kangpokpi are also functioning as the Electoral Registration Officers and Returning Officers for the Assembly Elections. In Valley Districts, the Deputy Commissioners function as the District Election Officers and the Sub-Divisional Officers function as Electoral Registration Officers/Returning Officers for the Assembly Elections. However, for the Parliamentary Election to the Lok Sabha, DC/Imphal West is the Returning Officer and all other DCs and ADCs Jiribam and Kangpokpi are the Assistant Returning Officers besides the Sub-Divisional Officers of all valley districts.

2. MAIN FUNCTIONS:

The main functions of the State Election Department are:

- (a) Preparation of Electoral Rolls of the 60 Assembly Segments of the two Parliamentary Constituencies of the State
- (b) Preparation and issue of Electors Photo Identity Cards,

- (c) Conduct of Election to the House of People and State Legislative Assemblies as well as the Presidential and Vice Presidential Elections and
- (d) To assist the Delimitation Commission in the delimitation of Assembly and Parliamentary Constituencies.
- (e) Appointment of statutory Officers like ROs, AROs, EROs, AEROs.
- (f) And any other election related works assigned by the Commission from time to time.

In all such works, the programmes and execution of the works are undertaken under the superintendence, direction and control of the Election Commission of India.

3. STAFF STRENGTH:

The Chief Electoral Officer has supporting staff strength of 168 numbers including one post each of Addl. CEO (recently created), Joint CEO and Asst. CEO and another 13 Election Officers. As on 7th March, 2007, Election Department's staff strength is as below:

Normally, one Election Officer each is posted at the office of DCs/DEOs in all districts. However, due to shortage of officers, no Election Officers are posted as on date in Tamenglong, Ukhru and Churachandpur districts.

4. ACHIEVEMENTS AND IMPORTANT EVENTS:

The main achievements and important events of the department during the financial year 2006-2007 (ending 6th March, 2007) are highlighted below:

- (i) **Visit of Shri Navin B. Chawla, Election Commissioner:** Shri Navin B. Chawla, Election Commissioner of Election Commission of India visited Imphal on 23rd Aug, 2006 on a 2(two) days official visit to the State. On his arrival, he called on His Excellency, the Governor of Manipur on 23rd August, 2006 itself. He met

Chief Secretary, DGP, Manipur, and all District Deputy Commissioners and Superintendents of Police. various issues which inter-alia including cleaning of Electoral Rolls, Rationalization of Polling Stations, resumption of EPIC programme, proper security provision for Assembly Elections, 2007, phasing out of Poll schedule etc. were discussed at length.

(ii) **Visit of Shri N. Gopaldaswami, Chief Election Commissioner:** Shri N. Gopaldaswami, CEC of Election Commission accompanied by Shri J.P. Prakash, Deputy Election Commissioner visited Imphal on 17th Oct, 2006 on a two days official visit to review the election preparedness of the just concluded 9th Manipur Legislative Assembly, 2007. They held a meeting with the representatives of recognised National and State Parties on 17th Oct, 2007 at 4.00 p.m. at Mini Conference Hall, Old Secretariat. Shri Gopaldaswami also held another two rounds of meetings the next day on 18th Oct, 2006: (i) with all Deputy Commissioners and Superintendents of Police at 9.30 a.m. and (ii) another with Chief Secretary, Director General of Police, Principal Secretary (Home) and Chief Electoral Officer Manipur thereafter. Finally, he held a Press briefing of the local media on 18th Oct, 2007 itself at 1st Bn. M.R.

(iii) **Visit of Full Election Commission:** Shri N. Gopaldaswami, Chief Election Commissioner accompanied by Dr. S.Y. Quraishi, Election Commissioner and Shri J.P. Prakash, Deputy Election Commissioner visited Imphal on 3rd January, 2007 to review the election preparedness for the just concluded 9th Manipur Legislative Assembly, 2007. Shri Navin B. Chawla, Election Commissioner arrived Imphal a day ahead that is on 2nd January, 2007. The visiting Election Commission held a meeting with the representatives of recognized National and State Parties on 3rd Jan, 2007 at Mini Conference Hall, Old Secretariat. The Full Commission further held a meeting with all Deputy Commissioners, DIGs and Superintendents of Police at 0900 hrs of 4th Jan, 2007. Various issues connected with the conduct of elections including the level of preparedness, final publication of Electoral Rolls, enforcement of Model Code of Conduct, classification of polling stations as sensitive, hyper-sensitive and normal, use of Videography & Digital cameras at identified polling stations, training on use of EVMs, appointment of polling personnel, deployment of Observers, use of helicopters for election related duties and other security arrangements relating to the conduct of the Assembly Elections-2007 were discussed. Thereafter, he held another meeting with the Chief Secretary, Director General of Police, Principal Secretary (Home) and Chief Electoral Officer. Before the departure of the Commission for Delhi on 4th Jan, 2007, they had a Press Briefing with local Media at 1st Manipur Rifles Club.

(iv) **Filling up of various vacant posts:** During the reporting year, 5(five) vacant posts of Lower Division Clerks (LDCs) were abolished vide Govt. Order No.42/Elec/Vol-III(Pt-I) dated 12th July, 2006. Further, 1(one) post each of Computer Programmer, Assistant Computer Programmer and Statistical Assistant were also created during the reporting year vide Govt. Order No.42/Elec/Vol-III(Pt-I) dated 12th July, 2006. The following 22(twenty two) posts were filled up on contract basis for a period of one year:

(v) **Training & Conference at Election Commission:** As directed by the Delimitation Commission of India, Shri T. Ranjit Singh, Joint Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur attended meeting on 17-18th April, 2006 at the Delimitation Commission to assist the CEO, Manipur. Shri T. Ranjit Singh, JtCEO accompanied by Shri Suman Dinda, CMC Engineer also attended the Conference of Jt.CEOs and SLAs on 7-8 August, 2006 at the ECI in connection with the computerization of Electoral Rolls (cleaning of Electoral Rolls and introduction of open source technology). Shri Th. Siddhartha Singh, Computer Programmer and Smt. L. Sujata Devi, Assistant Computer Programmer were deputed to ECI to attend one training programme on 9th Jan, 2007 on Genesys software and uploading of electoral roll database in ECI's website. Again, Shri Siddhartha and Smt. Sujata were deputed to the ECI to attend another training programme on 19th Feb, 2007 on Genesys Software pertaining to counting of votes.

(vi) **Summary Revision of Electoral Rolls, 2007:** As per the directions of the Election Commission of India, a Summary Revision of Electoral Rolls, 2007 with reference to 01-01-2007 as the qualifying date for all 60 (sixty) A.C.s in the State was taken up during the reporting year as per the schedule fixed by the Commission. The draft publication of E/Rolls was made on 16th October, 2006 whereas final publication of E/Rolls was made on 3rd Jan, 2007. The total numbers of electors admitted for inclusion in the whole State during the last Summary Revision was 28,958, whereas the total number of electors deleted was 13,951. Thus, the net addition of electors is 15,007. The total numbers of Electors after the Summary Revision-2007 is 17,01,401. The total number of electors before this Revision was 16,87,543. That is, the net percentage of increase of electors in the State during last Summary Revision-2007 after disposal of claims/objections was (+) 0.89%. The final Rolls were published with approval of the Commission.

Significant cleaning of electoral rolls was enabled through use of the ECI software and rigorous verification done through Booth Level Officers. 13,500 deletions (including 5,144 shifting cases) and 1,381 corrections were effected after verification by the EROs. A detailed polling station wise analysis was done and the Commission was apprised accordingly before obtaining its approval. The revised final Electoral Rolls (in PDF format) of all 60(sixty) A.C.s have been uploaded on CEO's website and ECI's website.

(vii) **Conduct of General Election to the 9th Manipur Legislative Assembly, 2007:** Elections to 9th Manipur Legislative Assembly were held in 3 phases on 8th (19 Constituencies), 14th (29 Constituencies) and 23rd February (12 Constituencies), 2007 at 2061 Polling Stations (901 in hills and 1160 in the valley). The Schedule of election followed as per ECI notification is enclosed at **ANNEXURE-I**. Facts at a glance pertaining to each phase of elections are given in **ANNEXURES-II, III, IV & V**. A total of 308 Candidates contested the Elections from 60 ACs, out of which 12 were women Candidates.

Polls were distinguished by a massive turnout of voters despite apprehensions expressed in various quarters following the calls given by some groups particularly in the hill areas to the voters and candidates to dissociate themselves from national and other state level political parties. Average voter turnout was recorded at **85.14%** (86.09% in 1st Phase, 87.32% in 2nd Phase and 78.40% in 3rd Phase) despite inclement weather in the first 2 phases of the poll and difficulty of terrain and movement in hill villages.

Arrangements for conduct of poll at the polling stations particularly those located in the hill areas had to be made in extremely difficult circumstances. While as many as 122 Polling Parties had to walk over distances ranging from 2 to 30 Km to reach the Polling Stations located in inaccessible hilly terrain, 4 Polling Stations were accessed by boat. Out of 901 polling parties in hills, 518 Polling Parties had to leave at least 2 days in advance to be able to reach the polling station well in time. Electoral arrangement also included extensive use of helicopters for transporting the election materials particularly the EVMs. As many as 133 EVMs were airlifted with the help of helicopters in the 3rd phase of elections from 21 helipads located in Chandel, Tamenglong and Churachandpur Districts and Jiribam Sub-division of Imphal East.

In the past, the State had never witnessed an extensive deployment of Central Para Military Forces (CPMF) as made during these elections. A total of 216 companies from BSF and CRPF (including 150 companies from outside the State had been provided by the MHA to the State Government in order to deploy the forces as per the scale and requirement as accessed by the election authorities for both pre-poll and poll related duties. While a minimum of one section of CPMF was deployed at all polling stations, two or more sections of armed CPMF was provided to polling stations that were considered either sensitive or hyper sensitive as per the assessment of district authorities. This ensured a completely incident-free and violence-free poll in the State. At the same time, this appears to have encouraged the electors to come out in large numbers and exercise their rights without fear or apprehension.

Assembly Elections-2007 were also distinguished by the fact that EVMs having the facility of recording the date and start and closure time of the poll were used for the first time in the country. The deployment of such a machine eliminated, at one stroke, the possibility of either conducting the poll a day earlier or reducing the poll hours as had been alleged in the past. At least 200 digital cameras were also used on the poll day in 600 out of 2061 polling stations to capture the critical and important events at the polling stations. Use of extensive communication plan with the help of communication facilities of all available agencies viz the State Wireless, Army, AR, CPMF in a co-coordinated manner helped the election authorities plan and anticipate the event properly and avoid any surprises and disruptions to the poll process.

Manipur, being a non-EPIC State (46.25% coverage), electors were allowed to cast vote on the basis of identity documents issued by competent authorities prescribed by the Commission including all Revenue authorities at all level and secretaries of Gram Panchayats, Small Town Committees and CEOs of Municipal Councils.

The results of elections and the partywise strength of Contesting/winning Candidates is given at ANNEXURE-VI. The list of elected members to the 9th Manipur Legislative Assembly Election, 2007 is at ANNEXURE-VII.

- (viii) **CEO's Official Website:** All important vital information such Electoral Rolls, Statutory Forms, Press Notes/Releases, Handbook for 9th Manipur Legislative Assembly Elections, 2007, Candidates' Affidavits etc. have been put up in CEO's website for information of general public and all concerned. AC-wise Maps showing the locations of polling stations have also been uploaded in CEO's website during the reporting year. E-registration facility for enabling the general public to submit Form-6 for inclusion of names in the Electoral Rolls has also been added in CEO's website during the reporting year.
