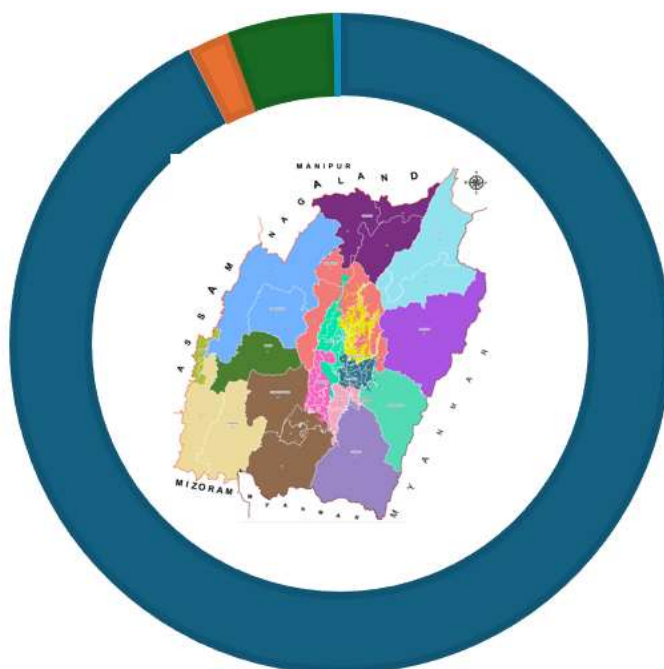

**Manipur Special Intensive Revision of Electoral Roll, 2026  
Key Findings of Enumeration Phase  
30.05.2026 to 28.06.2026**

**MANIPUR SIR: ENUMERATION PHASE FROM 30.05.2026 TO 28.06.2026**

**\* BLO did not find these electors or did not get back their Enumeration Forms because they:**

- Became electors in other States/UTs, or
- Were not found in existence, or
- Did not submit the form till 28<sup>th</sup> June , 2026 or
- Were not willing to register as an elector for some reason or other.

**Genuine electors can still be added back in electoral rolls during the Claims and Objections period 05.07.2026 to 04.08.2026, using Form 6, along with prescribed Declaration Form.**

**\*\* The name of the Electors found enrolled at multiple places in Electoral Rolls will be retained only at one place.**

The Election Commission of India (ECI) is implementing the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the Electoral Rolls in Manipur with clearly defined objectives to ensure maximum participation, complete inclusion of eligible electors, and full transparency at every stage of the process. The key objectives and activities undertaken under SIR are outlined below:

### **1. Participation of All Electors and All Political Parties:**

As on 28<sup>th</sup> June 2026, out of 20,93,076 electors, a total of 19,34,399 electors has submitted their Enumeration Forms, reflecting overwhelming participation during the Enumeration Phase of SIR.

The successful completion of this phase is the result of coordinated efforts of DEOs of all 16 districts, 60 EROs, 84 AEROs, 317 BLO Supervisors and 2956 BLOs deployed at 2956 polling booths, supported by volunteers. Field representatives of all 10 recognised political parties, including their District Presidents, also actively participated, with as many as 6363 Booth Level Agents (BLAs) appointed by them. It is important to note that at the beginning of the SIR, the Manipur had only 5003 BLAs. The increased number of BLAs indicates active participation of the political parties and their representatives in this important exercise.

### **2. Ensuring No Eligible Elector is Left Behind:**

- a. To ensure universal awareness and participation, during the enumeration period, CEOs, DEOs and EROs conducted extensive awareness campaigns and held multiple meetings with political parties to explain the process and shared updates on the progress of the enumeration phase of SIR at regular intervals.
- b. BLOs also conducted booth-level meetings with BLAs, who were permitted to file up to 50 Enumeration Forms per day to ensure their full involvement. BLOs carried out house-to-house visits to all existing electors to distribute Enumeration Forms, followed by at least three visits for collection. BLAs also made dedicated efforts to ensure that no eligible elector was missed.
- c. BLO-BLA coordination meetings were held by all 2956 BLOs with their respective BLAs to ensure thorough field verification of the Absent, Shifted, Dead, Duplicate electors.

### **3. Enumeration of Internally Displaced Persons**

- a. Enumeration forms were provided to the IDPs through the Nodal Officers of the District where they are presently residing. Duly filled enumeration forms of such electors were collected and handed over to Electoral Registration Officers of respective Assembly Constituency through the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur for digitization by the concerned BLO.
- b. The representatives of the recognized political parties were informed in this regard in a meeting conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> June 2026.

### **4. Special Initiative Taken:**

- a. Helpdesk were setup in offices of Chief Electoral Officer and all 16 District Election Officers to assist the electors to fill up Enumeration Forms. Helpline for public, 1950, was made operational 24x7. IT Helpdesk was operational on 24x7 basis to provide technical support to the BLOs, AEROs/EROs and the DEOs.

- b. Dedicated web-page for SIR has been uploaded on CEO website and daily Enumeration Form digitization status was updated every two hours on CEO Website. Advance search facility also provided on this dedicated SIR page wherein one can search by (i) details (name, age, gender, relationship) and/or (ii) serial or house no. This helps to view all other family members towards that said searched elector ascertaining the details of the elector and other Family Members.
- c. Optimisation of electors per polling station to less than 1,200 electors was maintained by Rationalising the Polling Station, resulting in an increase in the total number of Polling Stations to 3041 Polling Stations from 2956 Polling Stations, which is an increase of 85 Polling Stations.
- d. Creative use of social media in disseminating information about SIR.
- e. Digitization centre was instituted for shadow network polling stations wherein BLOs and volunteers gather for faster digitisation of EFs.

**5. Inclusion of Young Electors:**

- a. Young electors who have attained or will attain 18 years of age on 01.07.2026 are being encouraged to apply through Form-6 along with the prescribed declaration.
- b. Special campaigns will be conducted across State on two weekends. Specific dates will be intimated soon.

**6. Engagement with Electors and Political Parties**

Booth-level lists of electors reported as deceased, permanently shifted or whose forms were not received were shared with the Booth Level Agents appointed by the political parties for verification.

**7. Assistance by Election Staff and Volunteers**

The entire election machinery, supported by volunteers, is assisting electors, particularly senior citizens, PwD electors and vulnerable groups. Special care has been taken by the DEOs, EROs & BLOs to ensure that such categories of electors are facilitated.

**8. Redressal of Issues During Enumeration Period**

The District Election Officers of all Districts have addressed every issue reported through print, TV or social media to ensure that no grievance remains unattended.

**9. Scrutiny of Draft Electoral Roll**

- a. As per the SIR Order, the Draft Electoral Roll has been published on 5<sup>th</sup> July 2026 by the concerned Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) of all 60 Assembly Constituencies of the State.
- b. Booth-wise lists of Absent/Shifted/Death/Duplicate electors whose names are not included in the Draft Roll, has been displayed on the Notice Board of EROs to enable the general public to have access to the aforesaid lists along with the probable reasons for non-inclusion of their names and the said lists has also been published on CEO's website in an accessible format.
- c. The General Public/Electors and representatives of Political Parties may inspect/verify the Draft Photo Electoral Rolls at the offices of the Electoral Registration Officer/Assistant Electoral Registration Officer and with all the Booth Level Officers (BLOs) of all Assembly Constituencies and they may also visit Chief Electoral Officer,

Manipur's website <https://ceomanipur.nic.in> and ECINET mobile App, <https://voters.eci.gov.in>. to inspect the Draft Photo Electoral Rolls.

- d. A meeting with the representatives of National and State Political Parties was also held today **5<sup>th</sup> July 2026 at 11:00 AM** at the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur. The Political Parties have been apprised of the schedule of the Claim and Objections. Further, copies of the electoral rolls have been shared with the representatives of Political Parties.

**10. Claims and Objections period:**

- a. During the claims and objections period (5<sup>th</sup> July 2026 to 4<sup>th</sup> August 2026), any elector or political party may file claims or objections for inclusion of eligible electors or deletion. A total of 60 EROs and 84 AEROs are in position to scrutinize such cases.
- b. The primary objective of the Claim and Objections period is to include newly eligible and left out voters who have completed 18 years on or before 01.07.2026. Another objective is to give opportunities for correction in electors' particulars and also to invite objections against any wrong inclusion in the Electoral Roll.
- c. In case any elector was unable to submit their filled in Enumeration form within the specified time, it is appeal to the public to file **Form 6, along with prescribed Declaration Form for inclusion during the claims and objections period, which is from 05.07.2026 to 04.08.2026.**
- d. Application forms may be submitted to the Electoral Registration Officer, Assistant Electoral Registration Officer and Booth Level Officers through physical forms. Application forms may also be submitted online at **(1) <https://voters.eci.gov.in> and (2) ECINET Mobile App.**
- e. List of claims & objections in Forms-9, 10, 11, 11A & 11 B will also be available on the website of CEO, Manipur so that citizens are able to see the list and lodge objections with ERO concerned. The said list shall also be provided to the political parties on weekly basis
- f. Schedule of SIR after publication of Draft Electoral Rolls w.r.t 01.07.2026 as qualifying date.

11. **Notice and Verification phase**, starting 5<sup>th</sup> July 2026 to 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 2026, Electoral Registration Officers will scrutinise the eligibility of proposed electors submitted in Enumeration Forms and issue hearing notice to electors who could not be linked with Electoral Roll of previous SIR or linking has some discrepancy. No electors will be deleted without giving a proper hearing opportunity & passing speaking order. The electors can submit necessary documents (the list is mentioned on the backside of the Enumeration Form) during the hearing.

## 12. No Deletion Without Due Process

- a. As per Para 5(b) of SIR guidelines, no name can be deleted from the draft roll published on 5<sup>th</sup> July 2026 without notice and a speaking order by the ERO/AERO. Any aggrieved elector may appeal to the District Magistrate and thereafter to the Chief Electoral Officer under Section 24 of the RP Act, 1950.
- b. The Commission reiterates its firm commitment to a transparent, participative and inclusive revision process, ensuring that no eligible elector is left out and no ineligible name remains in the Electoral Rolls.
