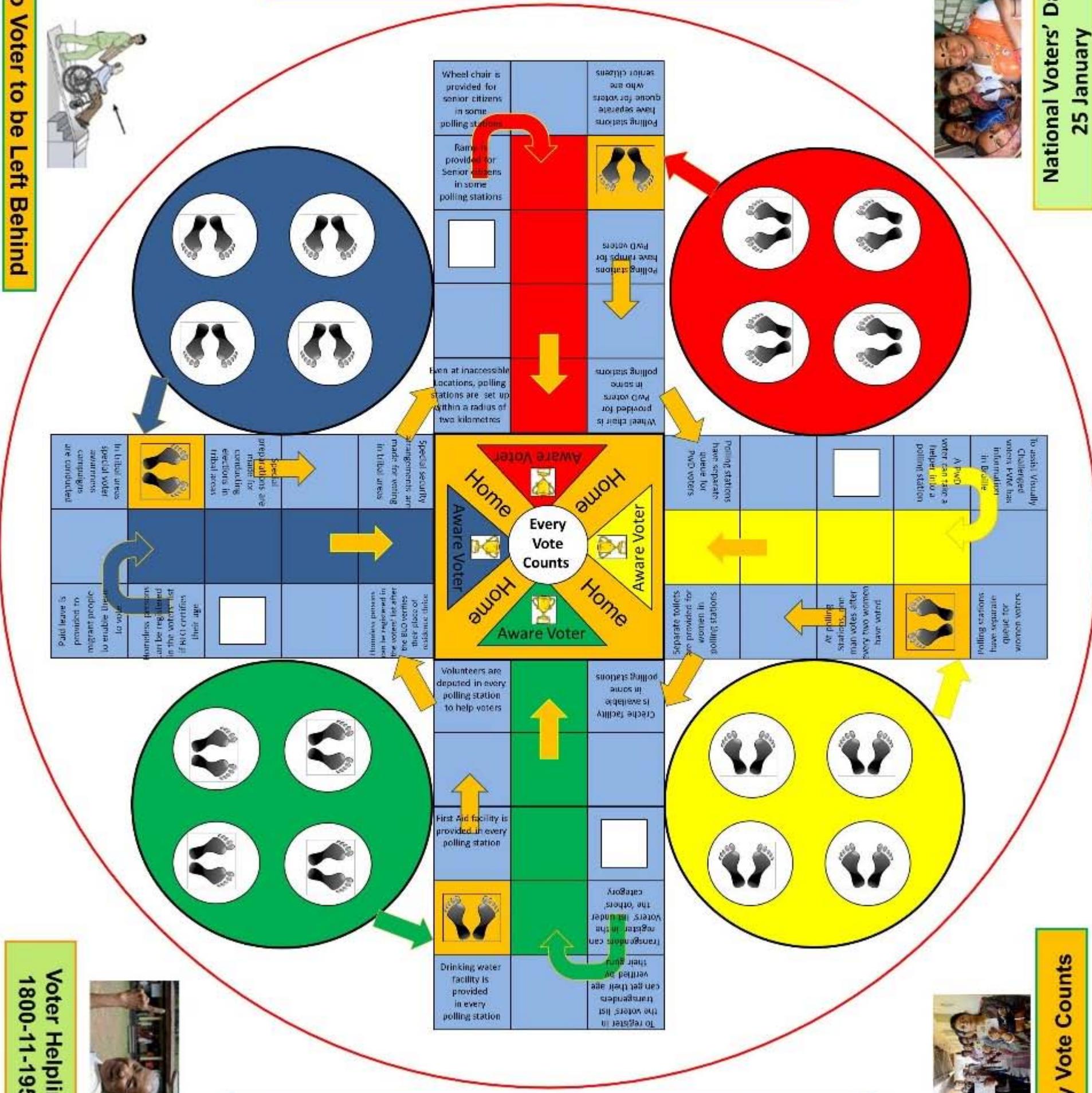

Easy and Accessible Voting

A game of Ludo to create awareness about Social Inclusion & Ethical Voting

Instructions for playing- This game can be played by two or more players. The players need to elect a leader before the game begins. All the players should read the instructions and then decide their order of playing the game with help from the leader. All the players stand outside and around the larger circle. The player who is first in the mutually decided order is blindfolded by the leader and is guided to the center of the circle by holding their hand. The leader then asks the player standing in the center to raise their right hand to shoulder level (as depicted on left side). Then the leader asks the player at the center to spin 2-3 times while standing and holding right hand in the same position. Other players encourage the blindfolded player spinning in the center by clapping their hands. When the player stops spinning, his or her hands should point at one of the boxes numbered from 1 to 12. The leader reads aloud the question in the box pointed by the player and asks the player to answer in "Yes" or "No". If the player at the center gives the correct answer then he or she gets another chance. If the player gives wrong answer then next player comes to the center for spinning blindfolded. Each player gets a maximum of 3 turns to play at the center. Likewise, all the players get a chance to play at the center in their pre-decided order.

Photocopies of proof of age and residence have to be submitted along with Form 6



Form 6A is filled by Non Resident Indians (NRI) to register their name in the voters' list



All forms pertaining to voters can be filled online at www.nvsp.in



www.eci.nic.in and www.nvsp.in provide all information related to elections

Form 7 is filled to appeal against the addition or deletion of a name in the voters' list



Form 2 is filled by armed forces personnel to enrol as service voters at their place of permanent residence



Form 8 is filled to make changes or corrections in the particulars in the voters' list



Form 8A is filled for transposition of residential address within the same constituency



**Instructions for playing-** This game can be played by 2 or 3 players at a time. The players can enter the game by standing at any of the ( ) . They need to find out 9 hidden messages by hopping on one leg through the maze. After finding the message, it needs to be read aloud by the player to all the bystanders. After reading aloud all the messages inside the maze, the player can exit through any route by hopping on one foot. The player who exits the maze after reading all the messages in the shortest time will be declared the winner. Timekeeping can be done by using a clock or by counting. **Remember:** Rules of the game can be modified by mutual decision of the players.

VVPAT shows a slip with the name of the candidate chosen by us and the symbol for 7 seconds.

No Voter to be Left Behind

**Instructions for playing-** This game can be played by one player at a time. There are 10 steps in the game and each carries one question. The player has to hop and stand on one foot throughout the game and loses if the other foot touches the ground. The player can enter the game by standing at ( ) and throwing a coin inside the first rectangle. The player can take a step inside the rectangle by reading aloud the question written in it and answering it in "Yes" or "No". Similarly, the player can progress by throwing the coin in the next rectangle and repeating the process until they reach the tenth rectangle. **Remember:** The answer to step 1 and step 4 is "No". Rules of the game can be modified by mutual decision of the players.

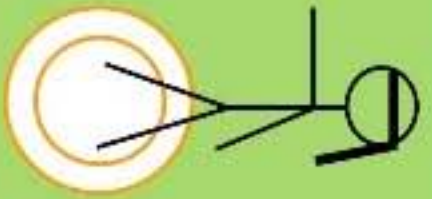

**Instructions for playing-** This game can be played by 3 to 6 players at a time. The players need to elect a leader before the game begins. The leader should read aloud the rules of the game to all the players. All the players form a queue at ( ) in a mutually decided order. The leader turns his back to the game and calls out any number from 1 to 6. The first player in the queue takes as many steps as the number called out by the leader. Similarly, the next player in the queue takes steps ahead based on the number called out by the leader and this continues until all the players have got their turns. Then the turn comes back to the player who was first in queue and this continues until all the players reach the finish line after tile 36. Whenever the player is standing on a tile which has a message, the player has to read it aloud to everyone. If the player lands on a tile with snake's head then the player goes down to the snake's tail. Whereas, if the player lands on a tile with a ladder then the player goes up to the other end of the ladder. The player who reaches the finish line the fastest wins the game. **Remember:** The game can also be played with the help of a dice.

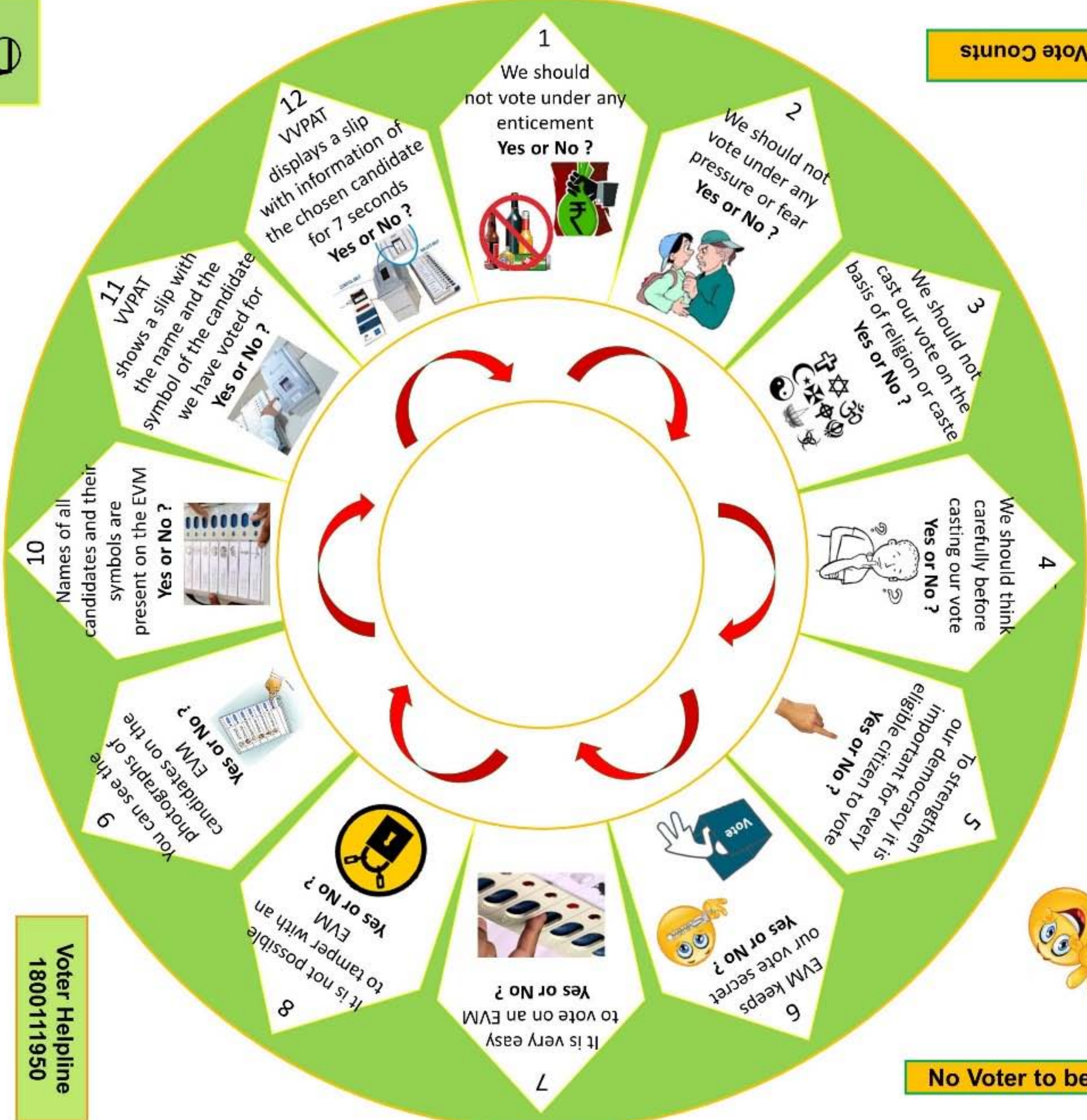
